No. 198: SYRACUSE (Sicily). Dionysius I, 406 – 367 B.C. Decadrachm in the style of Euainetos. Specimen with a great collection history and often published! Sharply struck, beautiful toning, extremely fine. Estimate: 30,000 euros

No. 223: PANTICAPAEUM (Tauric Chersonesos). Tetradrachm 355 - 340 B.C. Very rare! Dark toning, extremely fine. Estimate: 15,000 euros

No. 368: PYRRHUS. 297 - 272 B.C. (Epirus). Tetradrachm 295 - 275 B.C. Beautiful toning, miniscule scratches and dents, partial filing mark on the edge at 11h, almost extremely fine. Estimate: 8,000 euros

No. 434: LAMPSAKOS (Mysia). Stater ca. 395 - 350 B.C. Some minimal scratches, otherwise extremely fine. Estimate: 15,000 euros

No: 551: KANSIKA I, 127 - 151 A.D. (Kushan) 1/4 dinar (1.98 g). Extremely rare. First depiction of Buddha on a coin! Reverse minimal die crack, extremely fine. Estimate: 75,000 euros

No. 560: Ptolemaios I, 305 - 282 B.C. (Ptolemaic Kingdom) stater 305/4 - 300 B.C. Rare! Die crack on the obverse, reverse minimal sediment, extremely fine. Estimate: 10,000 euros

No. 750: ROMAN EMPIRE. Caligula, 37 - 41 A.D. Aureus A.D. 37. Rare! Very fine+. Estimate: 25,000 euros

No. 891: GETA as caesar, 197 - 209 A.D. AE medallion. 203 - 208 A.D. Very rare! Dark brown patina, very fine to extremely fine. Estimate: 8,000 euros

No. 936: PHILIPP I ARABS, 244 - 249 A.D. AE medallion. Brown patina, minimal rust on surface, almost extremely fine. Estimate: 7,500 euros

Auction 258 "Selected Coins from the Middle Ages to Modern Times" encompasses 521 lots. It includes the fourth part of the "Collection of an Aesthetic" which mostly contains German and European gold coins and medals of extraordinary provenances as well as numerous special pieces. No. 2195: LÜBECK. Gold medal worth 10 ducats 1694, unsigned. View of Lübeck from the east, above the symbol of Trinity in rays in-between clouds. Extremely rare. NGC AU 58. Miniscule scratches, almost extremely fine. Estimate: 5,000 euros

No. 2124: BRUNSWICK - CELLE / CALENBERG. Frederick of Celle, 1636 - 1648. Löser worth 3 talers 1647, Clausthal. Marking the imminent end of the Thirty Years' War. Yield from Harz pits. Mint master Lippold Wefer. Including value mark. Very rare, especially specimens of this grade. Gem. Beautiful patina, extremely fine-FDC. Estimate: 15,000 euros

No. 2244: SILESIA - MÜNSTERBERG - ÖLS. Charles II of Münsterberg, 1548 - 1617. 6 ducats 1616, Oels. Mint master Hans Tuchmann. Small test mark on the edge, miniscule planchet error in the field on the reverse, nevertheless an enticing extremely fine specimen. Estimate: 25,000 euros

No. 2291: HABSBURG. Ferdinand II, 1592 - 1618, as emperor 1619 - 1637. 5 ducats 1628, St Veit. Struck using taler dies. Extremely rare. Attractive specimen, miniscule engraved value mark "5" in the obverse field, nevertheless an extremely fine specimen with a beautiful patina. Estimate: 30,000 euros

No. 2311: WALLENSTEIN. Albrecht (+ 1634). Taler 1632, Jičín. Mint master Sebastian Steinmüller. Very rare, especially specimens of this grade. Very enticing, extremely fine specimen with a beautiful patina. Estimate: 30,000 euros.

No. 2312: TRANSYLVANIA. Stephan Bocskai, 1604 - 1606. 10 ducats 1605. Very rare. Attractive, very fine specimen with a gorgeous golden patina. Estimate: 25,000 euros

No. 2315: TRANSYLVANIA. Michael Apafi, 1661 - 1690. 10 ducats 1663, Hermannstadt. Off-metal strike in gold of taler dies (Resch 20). Extremely rare. Attractive specimen with a gold patina, extremely fine. Estimate: 50,000 euros

No. 2391: DANZIG. Stephan Bathory, 1577 - 1586. Three groschen 1579. Including the title of Stephan Bathory. Specimens of this grade are extremely rare. Show piece. Gorgeous patina. Almost FDC. Estimate: 5,000 euros

No. 2426: RUSSIA. Alexander III, 1577 - 1586, Gold medal worth 50 ducats 1883, by A. Griliches. Gold. Extremely rare. Gem made from polished dies. FDC. Estimate: 30,000 euros

No. 2476: INDIA. MUGHAL EMPIRE. Shah Jahan, 1628 - 1658. Mohur year of issue and mint indecipherable. Very fine. Estimate: 7,500 euros
