No. 1517: VIENNA. Gold medal of 6 ducats. N.d. (1616 - 1663), unsigned. **Very rare.** Very attractive piece with fine gold patina, extremely fine - brilliant uncirculated. Estimate: 15,000 Euro

Once again Gorny & Mosch will hold an e-auction after the public auction. On 12 March 2020, ancient coins and lots will be auctioned online starting at 10 a.m. Among them are additional coins from the Dr. G.W. Collection, Roman provincial coins from a southern German private collection the E.L. Collection, and Roman coins from the H.I. Collection. On 13 March 2020, coins, medals and lots from the Middle Ages to Modern Times will be auctioned from 10 a.m. onwards. A total of 1,046 lots with more inexpensive items and all lots will be auctioned off.
